- Children should receive Holy Communion when they reach the age of reason and demonstrate both knowledge and piety. Piety is manifest by attention and devotion.

- ❖ Each child must pass a test with one of our priests before First Confession and First Holy Communion. Test dates and times will be announced.
- ❖ Parents are the first educators of their children. It is the spiritual duty of parents to prepare their children for the sacraments through direct explanation and good example.
